Greetings from Hartland Christian Camp!

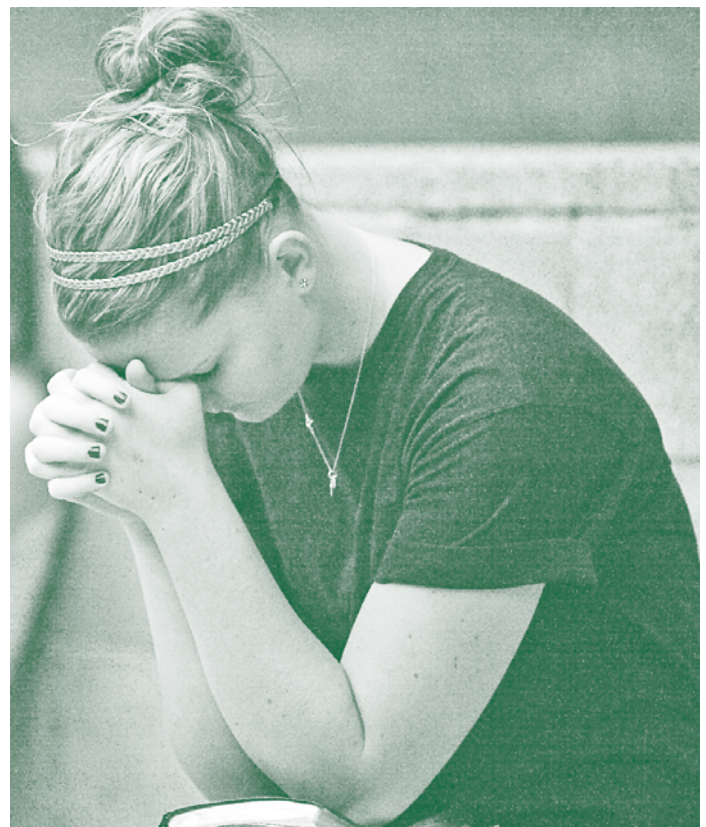

Thank you for your interest in this ministry. Please continue to pray with us that God might be brought glory through all that we say and do.

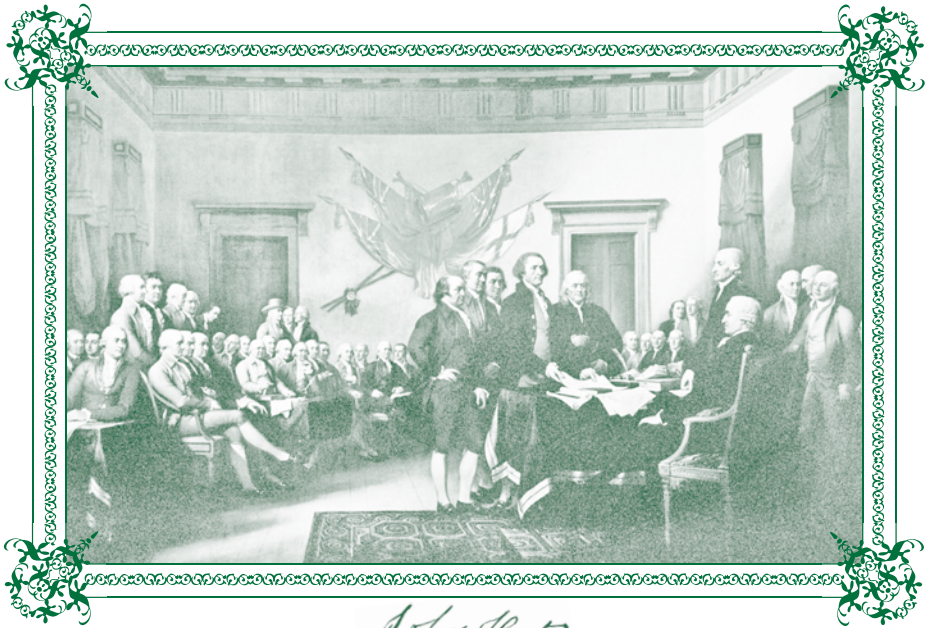

A Rich History

In the early seventeen hundreds there was a man named Michael Hart, who lived on Long Island. He moved to Hopewell Township, New Jersey, to a place very near the location where George Washington would, years later, make his famous crossing of the Delaware River during the Revolutionary War. Michael Hart had a grandson named John, who later became one of the signers of the Declaration of Independence. Interestingly, John Hart is the only signer of the Declaration of Independence of whom there is no picture today. John Hart's grandson, Michael, came to California around the time of the gold rush of 1849. He married a young lady by the name of Sarah Land and settled in Eshom Valley. The chimney of their home can still be seen today, near the Eshom Valley Cemetery. During the summers of those yearly years Michael and Sarah ran a lumber mill on Clipper Flat (now Hartland's ballfield) along Eshom Creek. Combining their last names, they called the area "Hartland", know today as Hartland Christian Camp.



John Hart

John Hart was one of 14 signers of the Declaration who did not appear in John Trumbull's famous painting (above) of the five-man drafting committee presenting their draft, an event that took place on June 28, 1776. Trumbull's painting is the source of the picture on the reverse of the two-dollar bill.

It has come to our attention that many people are not aware of all the activity that goes on at Hartland, not only in the summer season, but year-round. Over 7,500 guests will stay at Hartland in 2010. This includes what we call "Hartland Sponsored" camps, which are events where Hartland provides the program, speaker, music, etc., as well as "Rental Camps", where groups rent Hartland's facilities and conduct their own program. In fact, there are only 9 weekends during the year when there is not some kind of group at Hartland. During the months of September and October we are serving guests seven days a week.

Although we stay quite busy throughout the year, we would like to find ways to invite even more guests to join us and experience the life-changing ministry that takes place at camp.
